

WINSOR TOWNSHIP BOARD MEETING JANUARY 4, 2022

The regular meeting of the Winsor Township Board was called to order by Matt Reibling. Supervisor at 5:00 pm, in the township board room.

Present: David Armbruster, Nancy Heck, David McCormick Matt Reibling and John Walsh. Also present: Nick Pavlichek, Fire Chief, Todd Talaski, Huron County Commissioner and Andrew Johnson of Apple Blossom Wind Farms.

Todd Talaski reported on county activities and noted that a settlement in the DTE lawsuit is pending.

Andrew Johnson reported that Apple Blossom has completed most of it's scheduled blade repair, lightening protection has been installed and some land reclamation has begun.

The minutes of the last regular meeting had been distributed to each board member. There being no additions or corrections, the minutes were approved as presented.

After review, a motion was made by David McCormick, supported by Nancy Heck, to approve payment of the December, 2021 bills of \$12,075.33 and to authorize payment of the January 2022 bills of \$24,498.43. The motion carried.



Nick Pavlichek presented an Incident Report for 2021 and then discussed possible ARPA Funds equipment purchases and changes that may be needed for the fire hall.

A motion was made by John Walsh, supported by David Armbruster, to appoint Corey Oeschger as an Alternate to the Board of Review pending review of eligibility. The motion carried.

Matt Reibling reviewed possible township road and other projects for 2022 totaling \$701,000. A motion was made by John Walsh, supported by Nancy Heck, to approve the scheduled road and other projects. The motion carried.

There being no further business, a motion was made by David Armbruster, supported by Nancy Heck, to adjourn at 6:10 pm. The motion carried.
