

**WINSOR TOWNSHIP
BOARD MEETING
OCTOBER 5, 2021**

The regular meeting of the Winsor Township Board was called to order by Matt Reibling, Supervisor, at 5:00 pm, in the Township Boardroom.

Present: David Armbruster, Nancy Heck, David McCormick, Matt Reibling and John Walsh. Also present: Andrew Johnson from Apple Blossom Wind Farms and Jason Hannath from Community Input.Org.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Andrew Johnson gave an update on Apple Blossom projects including blade replacement and protection system upgrades.

The minutes of the last regular meeting, held on September 7, 2021 had been distributed to each member. There being no additions or corrections, a motion was made by David McCormick, supported by Nancy Heck, to approve the minutes. The motion carried.

A motion was made by John Walsh, supported by David McCormick, to approve the payment of the September 2021 bills of \$19,010.96, and to authorize payment of the October 2021 bills of \$75,478.25. The motion carried.

John Walsh presented Journal Entries and General, Road and Cemetery Fund Financial Statements as of September 30, 2021. A motion was made by David

McCormick, supported by David Armbruster, to approve the journal entries and financial statements. The motion carried.

Matt Reibling reported that one half of our ARPA Funds allocation had been received and will be set up in a separate fund. [\$34,017.50]

John Walsh reported that one bid was received for tree and stump removal in Grand Lawn Cemetery from Ed Demming of Superior Tree Service. John had met with members of the family that had been notified of the removal of their excess decorations. The family had been cordial but were visibly upset. A motion was made by David McCormick, supported by David Armbruster, to accept the bid from Superior Tree Service for tree and stump removal and to have him clean out the east side ditch. The motion carried.

John Walsh reviewed the March 31, 2021 Audit Report prepared by Nietzsche & Faupal CPAs, and noted that he has responded to the Michigan Department of Treasury regarding several deficiencies noted in the report. A motion was made by Nancy Heck, supported by David McCormick, to accept the Audit Report. The motion carried.


The Railroad St. ditching project was discussed. It was determined that further information is needed.
